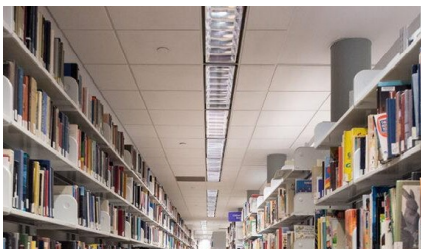

The goal of the project is to provide departments with relevant information about their students' learning, with minimal impact on faculty labor. As part of OAA's commitment to creating faculty-led practices, OAA is currently collecting faculty input and will be sharing an FAQ and results from its initial pilot semesters soon!
